NEW YORK HIGH SCHOOL JUNIOR LOOKING TO EXPAND HER MISSION TO TACKLE FOOD INSECUIRTY: ANY TAKERS IN HOUSTON?



Misha Gujja, a junior in high school, realized during the pandemic, the extent of food insecurity and wastage in her community. Discovering that millions of pounds of food are wasted in restaurants, she started **Fork and Spoon**, a student-led organization dedicated to addressing food insecurity in her community. Through strategic partnerships with local restaurants, Fork and Spoon collects surplus produce and food, ensuring that nothing goes to waste. Along with a team of <u>seven high school</u> <u>students</u>, Misha has scaled to deliver over

50 pounds per week of nutritious food to individuals and families in need, making a tangible difference in the lives of those facing food insecurity. Beyond their impactful local efforts, the founder of Fork and Spoon, who is also a resolute science researcher, is leading a groundbreaking initiative to facilitate collaboration with local farmers and research and development organizations in India, aiming to tackle the pressing challenge of agricultural productivity. By leveraging their passion for community service and their expertise in scientific research, Fork and Spoon is not only addressing immediate food needs but also pioneering innovative solutions to longterm global challenges.

With continued collaborations, she wants to bring Fork and Spoon's services to more people across the world who do not know where their next meal is coming from.
